Scope and content:

Also included are records such as Baker's student publications, committee work, press clippings, personal and professional correspondence, research papers and publications, pocket diaries, lectures, presentations, speeches, invitations and programs, contracts, honorary degrees, and his curriculum vitae.

Photographs include images of: the first graduation ceremony at UPEI in 1971; visit of table tennis players from China to UPEI in 1971; passport style images of Ronald Baker; Ronald Baker's first wedding to Helen Elder; Ronald Baker and his father James; presents received by Baker when he retired from UPEI; Baker's various medals and degrees as well as Baker wearing his Order of Canada Medall; UPEI President's house in Charlottetown; Baker at UPEI convocations; Baker attending a dinner at Government house and a Canada Council meeting in Montreal; UPEI Day in 1979; UPEI convocation

dinner in 1979; the Baker family leaving the UPEI President's House upon his retirement in 1978; Ronald Baker presiding at a citizenship ceremony for new Canadians; Baker with Chief Justice Trainor at the 1972 UPEI convocation; installation of Mount Allison University's third chancellor Dr. Angus J. MacQueen; Ronald Baker presenting greetings to J. Clair Callaghan at his installation as President of the Technical University of Nova Scotia; volunteer work with Canadian Executive Service Organization (CESO) in Bolivia; Ronald Baker receiving Simon Fraser University's President's 40th Anniversary Award; casual shots of Ronald Baker; as well as Ronald Baker giving his Order of Canada medal to UPEI President Eliot as a gift to UPEI. Other photographs include unidentified members of the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC), Mary Jean Woods, Carol Quartermain, and Ronald Baker's father James Baker.

Electronic records consists of records concerning the Institute for Departmental Leadership workshop held in PEI in September of 1983. Discs contain Canadianised material for the workshops prepared by Ronald Baker.

Postcards feature images of: Simon Fraser University; PEI Government House; Goodell Library; central Philadelphia; Bootham Bar in York, England; a print of At Newlyn Quay; and various locales throughout British Columbia and PEI. Also includes postcards: to James Baker from his granddaughter Ann and from Elizabeth Epperly to Frances Frazer.

Artifacts include the metal portion of a plaque commemorating the establishment of the Ronald J. Baker Entrance Scholarship UPEI. Also includes the following seven medals awarded to Ronald Baker: Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal; Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Medal; 125th Anniversary of the Confederation of Canada Meda; Queen Elizabeth II Silver Jubilee Medal; Canadian Centennial Medal; The War Medal (Great Britain); and the Order of Canada medal.

Audiocassettes include recordings of Ronald Baker playing the piano, music compiled by Mary Jean Woods, as well as a recording of a speech Baker gave to at a banquet given by the Canadian Society for the Study of Higher Education. Also includes a recording of Ronald Baker's address to the UPEI faculty in September of 1972.

Microfiche is a copy of the paper Teaching of the English Language, given by Ronald Baker as the plenary session at the Association of Canadian University Teachers of English conference at the University of Quebec in Montreal in May of 1980.

Biographical sketch:

Ronald James Baker was born in Lambeth, England on August 24, 1924, to James Herbert Walter and Ethel Frances Baker (nee Miller).

He attended the Country School for Boys in Sidcup in the London Borough of Bexley from 1935 to 1940.

From 1940 to 1943, Baker worked as an Air Raid Precautions Dispatch rider in London during the WWII blitz. From 1943 to 1947, he served with the Royal Air Force (RAF) as an Officer with the 8402 Canadian Disarmament Wing in Germany, as a Navigator / Flying Controller at Briggin Hill, and as a Disarmament Liaison Officer in Europe. He left the RAF as a Flight Lieutenant.

In 1947, he trained in Portage la Prairie, Manitoba, emigrated to Canada, and that same year married Helen ("Jo") Gillespie Elder (divorced 1975), with whom he had five children (Sharon "Ann", Lynn "Lyndy" Frances, Ian James, Sarah Jane, and Katherine Jean). He obtained Canadian citizenship in 1951.

Baker graduated with both a Bachelor of Arts (First Class Honors, 1951) and Master of Arts (1953) in English language and literature from The University of British Columbia (UBC). He worked as a lecturer from 1951 to 1953, as an instructor from 1953 to 1954 and 1956 to 1957, and as an Assistant Professor from 1957 to 1962 at UBC.

In 1954, Baker switched from the study of English Literature to the study of linguistics and spent two years (1954 to 1956) at the School of Oriental and African Studies at the University of London. During this time, he received fellowships from the Royal Society of Canada and the Humanities Research Council of Canada.

Baker returned to UBC in 1956 as a full time member of the Department of English. From 1956 to 1963, he taught literature and linguistics at UBC, and was a contributor to the report by UBC President Dr. John B. MacDonald *Higher Education in British Columbia, and a Plan for the Future* (1962) that led to the setting up of the University of Victoria and Simon Fraser University, and a number of two year colleges.

While at UBC, Baker initiated the university's first experiment with resident professors in outlying parts of the province. He spent the 1960-1961 academic year as UBC's first resident Professor in Prince George. While there, he also worked with the Indigenous community Nadleh Whut'en First Nation to study their Dakelh / Carrier language. He took recordings that formed a linguistic study of the Dakelh / Carrier language of that distinct area.

In 1962, he was appointed Associate Professor in UBC's Department of English.

In 1964, Baker became the first faculty member hired by Simon Fraser University President Patrick McTaggart-Cowan. He served as the Director of Academic Planning from 1964 to 1965 and during that time designed the University's trimester academic year and its lecture-tutorial system of teaching. He became Professor and the first Head of the Department of English from 1964 to 1968 and Professor of English from 1968 to 1969.

In 1969, Baker moved to Prince Edward Island (PEI), where he served as the first President of the University of Prince Edward Island (UPEI) from 1969 to 1978. Upon his retirement from the UPEI President's office in 1978. Baker was named President

Emeritus, in recognition of his accomplishments, and took up duties as a professor at the University. He was the inaugural David MacDonald Stewart Professor of Canadian Studies from 1988 until he retired in 1991. He was recognized as a UPEI Founder at the University's first Founders' Day in 2000, and the University's Baker Plaza was named in his honor in 2008.

It was on PEI that Baker married Frances Marilyn Frazer (1932-2010) in 1975, with whom he had one child (Ralph Edward "Teddy").

Baker served on numerous councils and committees throughout his career, including: Canadian Association of University Teachers (1954-1969); Canadian Linguistic Association (1956-1978); Association of Canadian University Teachers of English (1957-1968); Canadian Association of University Teachers (1954-1977); Canadian Council of Teachers of English (1957-1977); Canadian Council of Teachers of English (1968-1971); Canadian Society for the Study of Higher Education (1965-1976); Humanities Association of Canada (1956-1969); Canada Council (1970-1976); Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts (1971); The Royal Commonwealth Society (1972); Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada (1972-1978); Association of Atlantic Universities (1975-1977); Canada Council Consultative Group on Scholarly Publishing (1976-1979); Killam Committee, Canada Council (1984-1986); Selection Committee of Department of National Defense on Military and Strategic Studies (1985-1999); and the Canadian Citizen Court (1996-2004).

Ronald Baker retired in 1991. From 1989 to 2004, he volunteered with the Canadian Executive Service Organization (CESO) in the following capacities: with the Universidad del Valle in Bolivia (1989); Department of Indian Affairs and Mi'kmaq Confederacy of Nova Scotia (1991); First Nations Mission Housing Association and First Nations Healing our Spirit Association in Vancouver (1997); First Nations Health Council in Powell River in (1998); Metis Council of British Columbia in Chilliwack (2000); and the Treaty Council and bands in Cranbrook in British Columbia (2000).

Baker received Honorary Degrees (LL.D) from the University of New Brunswick (1970), Mount Allison University (1977), UPEI (1989), and Simon Fraser (1990).

Other awards include the Canadian Centennial Medal (1967), Queen Elizabeth II Silver Jubilee Medal (1977), Order of Canada (1978), 125th Anniversary of the Confederation of Canada Medal (1982), and the Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Medal (2002).

Ronald Baker died in Surrey, British Columbia on December 12, 2020, at the age of 96.

Biography:

Ronald Baker was born in England in 1924, emigrated to Canada in 1947 and obtained Canadian citizenship in 1951. Having obtained a BA (English Literature, 1951) and MA (English, 1953) from UBC, Baker began his academic career as a lecturer, instructor, Assistant Professor, and then as Associate Professor at UBC. He was a contributor to the report by UBC President Dr. John B. MacDonald *Higher Education in British Columbia, and a Plan for the Future* (1962) that led to the setting up of the University of Victoria and Simon Fraser University. He was the first faculty member hired at Simon Fraser University where he worked in the English Department. This was followed by a move to the newly established University of Prince Edward Island (UPEI) where he served as its first President from 1969 to 1978. Upon his retirement from the UPEI President's office, Baker was named President Emeritus, in recognition of his accomplishments, and took up duties as a professor at the University. He was the inaugural David MacDonald Stewart Professor of Canadian Studies from 1988 until he retired in 1991.

Baker served on numerous national councils and committees throughout his academic career and volunteered with a number of associations upon his retirement in 1991. Baker received Honorary Degrees (LL.D) from the University of New Brunswick (1975), Mount Allison University (1977), UPEI (1989), and Simon Fraser (1990). Other awards include the Canadian Centennial Medal (1967), Queen Elizabeth II Silver Jubilee Medal (1977), 125th Anniversary of the Confederation of Canada Medal (1982), Order of Canada (1978), and the Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Medal (2002).
