Scope and content:

Fonds consists of records created and accumulated by Roche family members from lona, Prince Edward Island. The records predominately document life at Saint Dunstan's University (SDU) between 1940 and 1969.

Textual records include SDU event programs, newspaper clippings, and a speech.

Photographs include SDU class group photographs, images of the SDU campus, as well as images of Father W. McGuigan, Maurice Smith, Jack Trainor, female SDU graduates in 1953, as well as images of the 1961 Honorary Degree recipients Judge A.E. Arsenault, Arthur Maloney, and Rt. Reverend G.J. McLellan.

Postcards feature images of SDU group class photographs.

Sound and moving image records include an audio recording of the first Hootenanny mass at Saint Dunstan's University. Also included is black and white and color footage of the SDU campus, students, sports, convocations, and events filmed in the early 1950s.

Biographical sketch:

Michael Joseph Roche (1891-1983) and Catherine Emma Mooney (1896-1994) lived in Iona, Prince Edward Island. They had twelve children: Edmund (1919-1994); Mary Ellen (1921-2014); Emmett (1923-1981); Ivan (1925-1996); Clarence (1927-1981); Anita (1932-); Lucille (1935-2022); Charles (1934-2022); Adelbert (1938-); Louis; Sister Teresa; and Margaret.

Of their twelve children, five sons attended Saint Dunstan's University (SDU).

Reverend Edmund Joseph was a graduate of the SDU class of 1941. He studied Theology for four years at Holy Heart Seminary in Halifax and was ordained in 1945 by Most Reverend James Boyle, Bishop of Charlottetown. He did postgraduate work at Notre Dame University in Indiana. Reverend Edmund was also a Parish Priest and

Professor of Mathematics and Religion at SDU. At SDU, he has held the positions of Dean of Studies and Registrar. He also served as the General Secretary of the Canadian Catholic Conference of Bishops, the only priest from Prince Edward Island to serve in that capacity. In 1997, the Cass Science Hall building was rededicated to Father Cass, and the floors of the building were named in honor of the priests who pioneered the study of science at St. Dunstan's University, which included Reverend Edmund Roche.

Reverend Clarence Roche was a graduate of the SDU class of 1949 and was ordained in May of 1953. He was a Parish Priest who was murdered in his parish rectory in Kelly's Cross, PEI, in 1981.

Emmett was a graduate of the SDU class of 1953, Charles the SDU class of 1955, and Adelbert the SDU class of 1958.
